1 The Inevitable Vector Toward Global Unity

- ✓ History has a clear directional arrow: over millennia, human culture has inexorably moved from a chaotic mosaic of isolated tribes toward a single, unified global civilization.
- ✓ In 10,000 BC, Earth was populated by thousands of small, isolated human worlds; by AD 1450, over 90% of humanity lived within a single interconnected Afro-Eurasian mega-world.
- ✓ When Spanish conquistadors landed in the Americas in 1492, they connected the last isolated human worlds, creating the first truly planetary economic and political network.



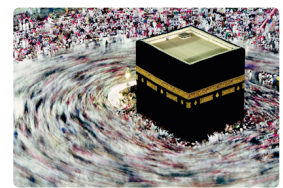
World in AD 1450: consolidating isolated worlds into a dominant Afro-Eurasian sphere.

2 Cognitive Dissonance as the Engine of Progress

- ✓ No human culture is completely coherent; every society harbors contradictory values, and the friction between these opposing ideals drives historical debate and cultural evolution.
- ✓ Rather than destroying cultures, the psychological tension between clashing beliefs forces civilizations to innovate, debate, and renegotiate their laws.
- ✓ Modern Western society cherishes both "Liberty" and "Equality," yet maximizing personal freedom inevitably produces economic inequality, while enforcing strict equality requires limiting personal liberty.

3 The Three Universal Unifiers of Humanity

- ✓ Over the past three thousand years, humanity was brought together not by moral treaties, but by three universal imagined systems that treat all humans as potential participants.
- ✓ The three great unifiers are: **Money** (economic), **Empires** (political), and **Universal Religions** (ideological).
- ✓ Roman coins, Roman legionary garrisons, and the spread of Christianity unified dozens of completely hostile Mediterranean tribes into a single, cohesive civilization where complete strangers traded and worshipped under the same rules.

4 The Myth of Cultural Purity

- ✓ No human culture today is "authentic" or "pure"; every society is the result of thousands of years of violent conquests, commercial borrowing, and foreign cross-pollination.
- ✓ What nationalistic groups defend as ancient traditions are almost always foreign elements adopted from past conquerors or global trade routes.
- ✓ Traditional Italian food relies fundamentally on tomatoes, Irish cuisine on potatoes, and Swiss culture on chocolate, yet none of these ingredients existed in Europe until they were imported from the Americas after 1492.

5 The Emergence of the Planetary State

- ✓ In the 21st century, the sovereign nation-state is becoming obsolete because global challenges cannot be solved by individual governments acting alone.
- ✓ Ecological collapse, financial contagions, and the regulation of artificial intelligence cross all borders, forcing human societies toward a unified global framework.
- ✓ International agreements like the Paris Climate Accords and global financial networks demonstrate that humanity is steadily transitioning into a single, planetary community.
